Chilies are excellent sources of vitamins A, B, C and E with minerals like molybdenum, manganese, folate, potassium, thiamin, and copper. A chili contains seven times more vitamin C than an orange.

Ever since its introduction to India in 1498, chilies have been included in Ayurvedic medicines and used as tonic to <u>ward off</u> many diseases. A new study recently published in the Journal of the America Heart Association has given us another solid reason to support one of our favorite snacks. The **wholesome** treat ? Almonds.

During the study, two groups of participants who all had high LDL (bad cholesterol) levels each followed a healthy diet for 12 weeks. During the first six weeks, one group enjoyed a 1.5-ounce portion of almonds for a snack, while the other group ate a carbohydrate-rich muffin for a snack. Aside from the snack, the two groups had the same diet. The groups switched snacks for the second six weeks but again otherwise followed the same **diet**.

Researchers found that when the two groups snacked on the almonds rather than the muffins, they reduced both their LDL and total cholesterol levels. Plus, eating the almonds raised their HDL (good) cholesterol levels, while eating the muffin decreased HDL levels. What's more is that even though overall body weight did not change when participants were snacking on almonds versus muffins, their belly fat and waist circumference went down. And get this: both the muffin and the portion of almonds contained nearly the same number of calories (273 and 253, respectively) and both diets had the same overall number of calories.

This evidence shows strong support for the argument that it's the quality of calories that make for a healthy diet, not just quantity. The fact that almonds are rich in protein, fiber, and vitamin E -nutrients muffins score much lower in-most likely played a role in the results of this study. So next time you reach for a snack, think: nutrient-rich!

Traditionally for the Chinese, Chinese New Year was the most important festival on the calendar. The entire attention of the household was fixed on the celebration. During this time, business life came nearly to a stop. Home and family were the principal focuses. In preparation

for the holiday, homes were thoroughly cleaned to rid them of "huiqi," or **inauspicious** breaths, which might have collected during the old year. Cleaning was also meant to appease the gods who would be coming down from heaven to make inspections. Ritual sacrifices of food and paper icons were offered to gods and ancestors. People posted scrolls printed with lucky messages on household gates and set off firecrackers to frighten evil spirits. Elders gave out money to children. In fact, many of the rites carried out during this period were meant to bring good luck to the household and long life to the family-particularly to the parents.

Most important was the **feasting.** On New Year's Eve, the extended family would join around the table for a meal that included as the last course a fish that was symbolic of abundance and therefore not meant to be eaten. In the first five days of the New Year, people ate long noodles to symbolize long life. On the 15th and final day of the New Year, round dumplings shaped like the full moon were shared as a sign of the family unit and of perfection.

Mass bleaching has killed more than a third of the coral in the northerns of Australia's Great Barrier Reef, though corals to the south have 416 with little 417, scientists said.

Researchers who conducted months of __418__ and underwater surveys of the 2,300-kilometer (1,400-mile) reef off Australia's east coast found that around __420__percent of the coral in the northern and central sections of the reef are dead or dying, said Terry Hughes, director of the ARC Centre of Excellence for Coral Reef Studies at James Cook University in Queensland state. And some parts of the reef had __419 __ more than half of the coral to bleaching.

The __420__of the damage, which has occurred in just the past couple of months, has serious __421__, Hughes said. Though bleached corals that haven't died can __422__ if the water temperature drops, older corals take longer to bounce back and likely won't have a chance to recover before the next bleaching event occurs, he said. Coral that has died is gone for good, which affects other creatures that rely on it for food and shelter.

"Is it surprising? Not anymore. Is it __423__? Absolutely," said Mark Eakin, the coral reef watch coordinator for the U.S. National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

"We're talking about losing 35 percent of the population of coral in some of these reefsthat's huge."

The damage is part of a massive bleaching event that has been impacting reefs around the world for the past two years. Experts say the bleaching has been __424__ by global warming and El Nino, a warming of parts of the Pacific Ocean that

changes weather worldwide. Hot water puts stress on coral, causing it to turn white and become __425__ to disease. Other reefs have suffered even more severely from the recent bleaching; Some Pacific islands, for example, have reported coral death rates of more than 80 percent, Eakin sai

The average population density of the world is 47 persons per square mile. Continental densities range from no permanent inhabitants in Antarctica, where the temperature is freezing, to 211 per square mile in Europe. In the western hemisphere, population densities range from about 4 per square mile in Canada to 675 per square mile in Puerto Rico. In Europe the range is from 4 square mile in Iceland to 831 per square mile in the Netherlands. Within countries tons of population densities. For example, in Egypt, the average is 55 persons per square mile but 1300 persons inhabit each square mile in settled portions where the land is arable.

High population densities generally occur in regions of developed industrialization, such as the Netherlands, Belgium, and Great Britain, or where lands are intensively used for agriculture, as n Puerto Rico and Java.

Low average population densities are characteristic of most underdeveloped countries. Lowdensity of population is generally associated with a relatively low percentage of cultivated land. This generally results from poor quality lands. It may also be due to natural obstacles to cultivation, such as deserts, mountains, or malaria-infested jungles; to land uses other than cultivation, asre and forested land; to primitive methods that limit cultivation; to social obsland ownership systems which keep land out of production. re economically advanced countries of low population density have, as a rule, lar

portions of their populations living in urban areas. Their rural population densities are usually very low.
